GETTING STARTED:

City planning should be your first step in the FC project. Resources to help you develop an initial plan:

Once you have an initial plan, you can test your ideas with simulation, i.e., SimCity.

SIMCITY:

DOWNLOADS: With a few exceptions, you should have all received your SimCity download codes. If not, let me know asap.

OFFLINE MODE (SINGLE-PLAYER MODE): Remember that all cities need to be developed in offline – or "Single-Player" mode. If you start SimCity and it asks you to select a server (ex., Asia 1, North America East 2), you are online!

Also, you must develop your city in the Whitewater Valley region. You can choose any city site within that region, but you must be in Whitewater Valley. And, not "sandbox" mode.
